She pays house calls

Snow can't stop teacher from seeing science projects

A calamity day at Clark-Shawnee Local schools gave a new meaning to the nature of science.

Possum School's eighth-grade science fair was scheduled for Thursday, but snow and freezing temperatures canceled school and the fair.

Instead, science teacher Sue Calland is making house calls to judge the projects, which range from diaper capacity to bacterial growth.

Calland and friend Shawna Grafton expect to have each of the five projects reviewed by today.

The fair couldn't be delayed — the district's schools are closed today for a conference makeup day and Monday for Presidents' Day.

But the projects needed to be judged to determine who will proceed to the district fair in March, Calland said.

Mackenzie Taylor spent Wednesday night putting the finishing touches on his bacteria project.

"I was going to be disappointed if I stayed up late and had to wait a whole four days to present it," he said after Calland and Grafton questioned him about his project.

Mackenzie said presenting the project at home was easier because he

didn't have to cart 15 petri dishes of bacteria solution to school.

The science fair is voluntary for eighth-graders, Calland said. Students began their projects in December.

Superintendent Debbie Finkes was at first surprised that Calland would

go door-to-door but said it is typical of the staff's dedication.

"She's one of those teachers kids love, and she always has their best interests at heart," Finkes said.
