Science Teacher, Put-in-Bay
Schools**

Melissa Kowalski teaches grades 7-12 science at Put-in-Bay Schools on South Bass Island in Lake Erie, and her classroom is built around one big idea: students learn science best by doing science. The island's ecosystems, and its role in bird and pollinator migrations, give students a front-row seat to environmental systems in motion. With Kowalski's guidance, students collaborate with experts, collect meaningful data, and see how their work supports conservation in their own community. Recently, one of the monarch butterflies tagged by students was recovered over 2,000 miles away in El Rosario, Mexico.
